Pinnacle Family Advisors, LLC is registered with the Securities and Exchange Commission as an investment adviser and, as such, we provide advisory services rather than brokerage services. Brokerage and investment advisory services and fees differ and it is important for you, our client, to understand the differences. Additionally, free and simple tools are available to research firms and financial professionals at Investor.gov/CRS, which also provides educational materials about broker-dealers, investment advisers, and investing. This document is a summary of the services and fees we offer to "retail" investors, which are natural persons who seek or receive services primarily for personal, family, or household purposes.

What investment services and advice can you provide me?

We offer the following investment advisory services to retail investors: **Asset Management Services**; **Family Office and Wealth Planning Services**; **Selection of Other Advisers**; **Pension Consulting Services**; **Financial Planning and Consulting Services**; **and AdvisorK Retirement Asset Management.** We also offer standalone **Business Consulting Services**. - **Account Monitoring:** If you open an investment account with our firm, as part of our standard service we will monitor your investments on a quarterly basis.
- Investment Authority: We manage investment accounts on a discretionary basis whereby we will decide which investments to buy or sell for your account. We have discretion to select, retain or replace third-party managers to manage your accounts. You may limit our discretionary authority (for example, limiting the types of securities that can be purchased or sold for your account) by providing our firm with your restrictions and guidelines in writing. We also offer non-discretionary investment management services whereby we will provide advice, but you will ultimately decide which investments to buy and sell for your account. You have an unrestricted right to decline to implement any advice provided by our firm on a non-discretionary basis.
- <u>Investment Offerings:</u> We provide advice on various types of investments. Our services are not limited to a specific type of investment or product.
- <u>Account Minimums and Requirements:</u> In general, we do not require a minimum dollar amount to open and maintain an advisory account; however, we have the right to terminate your account if it falls below a minimum size which, in our sole opinion, is too small to manage effectively.

What fees will I pay?

The following summarizes the principal fees and costs associated with engaging our firm for investment advisory services. For detailed information, refer to our Form ADV Part 2A, Items 5 and 6 by clicking this link https://adviserinfo.sec.gov/firm/brochure/145628.

- Asset Based Fees Payable quarterly in advance. Since the fees we receive are asset-based (i.e. based on the
 value of your account), we have an incentive to increase your account value which creates a conflict especially for
 those accounts holding illiquid or hard-to-value assets;
- Hourly and Fixed Fees Payable as agreed upon;
- Fixed Fees Payable guarterly in advance.
- Business Consulting Fees Payable as agreed upon; and
- Advisory fees charged by third party money managers, which are separate and apart from our fees;
- Examples of the most common fees and costs applicable to our clients are: custodian fees; account maintenance fees; fees related to mutual funds and exchange-traded funds, fees from management of affiliated investment company products; transaction charges when purchasing or selling securities; and other product-level fees associated with your investments

You will pay fees and costs whether you make or lose money on your investments. Fees and costs will reduce any amount of money you make on your investments over time. Please make sure you understand what fees and costs you are paying.

Key Questions to Ask Your Financial Professional

 Help me understand how these fees and costs might affect my investments. If I give you \$10,000 to invest, how much will go to fees and costs, and how much will be invested for me?

What are your legal obligations to me when acting as my investment adviser? How else does your firm make money and what conflicts of interest do you have? When we act as your investment adviser, we have to act in your best interest and not put our interest ahead of yours. At the same time, the way we make money creates some conflicts with your interests. You should understand and ask us about these conflicts because they can affect the investment advice we provide you. Here are some examples to help you understand what this means.

- We recommend investment in Mutual Funds that are issued, sponsored, and managed by our firm. We receive
 compensation for management of these Mutual Funds. In addition, we recommend, when appropriate, investment
 in a Private Fund managed by an affiliated investment adviser. Individuals associated with our firm are
 compensated as a result of investments in the Private Fund. We have a financial incentive to recommend such
 proprietary investments;
- Persons providing investment advice on behalf of our firm may also be lawyers, and/or accountants. Fees for
 these services are separate for our advisory fees. This practice presents a conflict of interest because they have
 an incentive to recommend these based on the compensation received rather than solely based on your needs.
- We may trade client accounts on margin where the amount of our fee is based on the absolute market value. This
 creates a conflict of interest where we have an incentive to encourage the use of margin to create a higher market
 value and therefore receive a higher fee. The use of margin may also result in interest charges in addition to all
 other fees and expenses associated with the security involved.
- Persons providing advice on behalf of our firm are registered representatives with a broker-dealer. These persons
 receive compensation in connection with the purchase and sale of securities or other investment products.
 Compensation earned by these persons is separate and in addition to our advisory fees. This practice presents a
 conflict of interest because they have an incentive to recommend investment products based on the
 compensation received rather than solely based on your needs.
- Persons providing investment advice on behalf of our firm are licensed as independent insurance agents. These
 persons will earn commission-based compensation for selling insurance products. Insurance commissions are
 separate and in addition to our advisory fees. This practice presents a conflict of interest because they have an
 incentive to recommend insurance products to you for the purpose of generating commissions rather than solely
 based on your needs.

How do your financial professionals make money?

The financial professionals servicing your account(s) are compensated in the following ways: Salary; Bonus; Product Sales Commissions; Financial professionals' compensation is based on the amount of client assets they service; the products sold (i.e. differential compensation); the revenue the firm earns from the person's services or recommendations, and management of proprietary investment company products. Financial Professionals' compensation is also derived through our firm or its affiliated entities for providing pension consulting services, sub-advisory services to other investment advisers, raising capital, and sales and distribution of other advisers' services and funds

Do you or your financial professionals have legal or disciplinary history?
